

Clyde Austin 4-H Center Environmental Education Program Student Preparation Form - - Overnight Groups

Students should be at the school on b	y	•
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- 1. Bring ONE medium-sized suitcase/duffel bag with your name on it.
- 2. Permanently label all belongings. Any items left at the 4-H Center will be discarded. It is the responsibility of each student to keep track of his/her possessions.
- 3. If desired, bring a small amount of money for the Concession Stand (\$5.00-\$20.00).
- 4. Bring a plastic bag to store wet clothing on the return trip.
- 5. This is an outdoor adventure program. Prior to your visit to Camp Explore, please be aware of the weather forecast. Pack clothing appropriate for all types of weather (warm, cold, hot, and wet). Your clothes may get dirty, so dress accordingly!

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE RECOMMENDED FOR A 2 or 3 DAY PROGRAM:

Clothing:

3 pairs of jeans or shorts, 3 T-shirts, 1 or 2 sweat shirts, 1 jacket, 3 sets of underclothes, 2 pairs of flat shoes (tennis shoes or hiking boots are best), 4 pairs of socks, 1 pair of pajamas, 1 set of rain gear, gloves, and hat for cooler weather.

Linens:

Twin bed sheets and blanket or sleeping bag, pillow and pillow case, towels and washcloth.

Toiletries:

Toothbrush, toothpaste, brush and comb, deodorant, soap, shampoo, insect repellent, other items as appropriate.

You may bring:

Pen, pencil, notebook, camera and film, and binoculars.

Do not bring:

Radio, tape or CD player, electronic video games, cellular phones, pagers, expensive jewelry, curling iron, drugs, alcohol, chewing gum, food, fireworks, firearms, knives, matches, lighters, or any items which could be detrimental to the 4-H Center grounds or dangerous to other participants. Avoid packing items in breakable containers.
